Remembering Ivannia Soto



The Whittier High School Alumni Association mourns the loss of author, educator and 2016 Hall of Fame inductee Dr. Ivannia Soto-Hinman, who passed away on April 23 at the age of 48 after an eight-year battle with cancer.

Born in Los Angeles, Soto graduated from Whittier High School in 1994. Ivannia received a bachelors and dual masters from Biola

University and PhD in Education from Claremont Graduate University in 2005. She taught at Whittier College from 2009 until her death.

A member of the Jaime Escalante teaching tree, Soto's specialty was the pedagogy of English language acquisition. Soto authored 12 books, including *ELL Shadowing: A Catalyst for Change.* She was the director of the Bilingual Educator Strategic Training project and served as a board member of the California Commission on Teacher Education

Soto divided her time between Whittier and the California Central Coast. She is survived by her husband Ron Skamfer and dog Frida.

Principal Liggett's Last Update

Greetings, Whittier High School alumni. As of this writing, we are just days away from the Commencement Ceremony of the Class of 2024 on June 4, 2024. This is an outstanding senior class with nearly 15% of the students graduating Cum Laude with at least a 3.9 cumulative, weighted GPA. This includes 17 students who are graduating Summa Cum Laude (with a 4.3 GPA or higher) and 19 Cardinal Key winners who embody the very best of the Cardinal Creed and virtues of Cardinals with CLASS. Keeping in mind that this is the graduating class that began high school online during the 2020-2021 "COVID Year", their accomplishments are that much more impressive. I know that they are all excited to join the ranks of the alumni when they cross the stage next week.

Graduations are always bittersweet for those of us in education, but this one is particularly so for me. This will be my final graduation as the principal of Whittier High School as I have accepted a new position within the district beginning in July.
